Primary Maths Curriculum:

There are a number of changes being made to the primary curriculum at the moment. We have implemented a new Primary Language Curriculum in the last few years and have been learning about the new Primary Maths Curriculum this year. This is due to be implemented from September. In the junior end

of the school you will see new Maths books which will be aligned with this new curriculum. The content will stay largely the same but the way we engage with the curriculum and ask the children to engage with the curriculum will be changing. Each class in the school gets a volunteer each year and we are very grateful to the many volunteers who provide these learning opportunities for our children and to the companies that release their employees for this.
