Dear Parents,

We are now into the second half of the school year. Time is flying and there are lots of activities going on. Academic work is at the heart of what we do every day but we also have a responsibility to educate the whole child. We work very hard to provide as wide a range of activities as possible to allow every child flourish and shine. We have a great group of children and a very dedicated team of staff so we have a lot to be proud of. Here are the highlights of the last month in our school.

FAI 5-a-side Competition:

We entered three teams in this competition which was held in Carrigtwohill. Even though this was the competition for boys some of our girls took part as well. All of our players played really well and represented our school excellently. It was an exciting, fun and enjoyable day. We were very competitive and only narrowly missed out on progressing to the finals. Ronan Murray, one of our past pupils, helped us out on the day and we were grateful for his help. Well done to all involved. The girls are playing on Friday so they will be training at lunchtime this week.

Challenge Matches:

In preparation for this competition, we played a number of challenge matches. We travelled to Carrigtwohill to play one of the primary schools there. Our boys and girls took part and learned a lot.

Park NS, from outside Youghal, travelled up to play us in a challenge match before midterm. Our Parents Association arranged treats and medals for the children to mark this special occasion which added to the whole experience.

It is a pleasure to be able to take our students out for these activities and to be able to trust that they will behave properly and represent our school community well.

Chess Club:

Our Winter Chess Club ran from October midterm to the February midterm. Nearly forty children took part every week on Mondays and Fridays after school. It was great fun watching the children playing together and learning from each other. Children can come to my room at lunchtime to play chess any day that I don't have training on the pitch.

Hurling:

Our Confirmation Class went to The Parish Centre for a retreat to help them to prepare for their upcoming sacrament. Liz and Kathryn led them through some prayers, hymns and reflections. It was a lovely occasion and allowed the children some time out of school to think about what they are about to receive. Thank you to Fr. Damien for organising this.

Graduation Hoodies:

6th Class got their graduation hoodies this week. It is a badge of honour and a recognition of what they have achieved in their time in primary school. It also allows them to stand out and be recognised as being on the cusp of moving onto the next stage. They still have a lot of work to do but they are onto the last lap of primary school now.

Past Pupils Work Experience:

We have had six past pupils in on work experience this year so far as part of their Transition Year Programme. It is great to see out past pupils and hear how they are getting on as they get closer to being adults. We have limited capacity each year to accommodate students on work experience but we do our best to fit in as many as possible, especially those who are interested in working in school when they grow up.

Local Schools Network:

We are part of a network of primary schools in the East Cork area from Glanmire to Midleton. We meet regularly to share resources and ideas. Over the last two months, teachers from third and fourth classes have been meeting in different schools to share teaching strategies and to discuss the latest methodologies. This helps every teacher to improve and in turn, improves the education provided to your child. Together we are stronger.

Basketball:

Mark continues to coach our students every week. 2nd, 3rd and 4th have finished their block and Senior Infants and 1st will be start this week. There will be basketball fun day at the end of June to celebrate the progress made during the year.

Swimming Gala:

We have swimming trials for the gala this week. This is our first time entering a gala so we are excited to see how our swimmers get on. On March 12th we will have our final day of swimming for 3rd-6th to make up for the day we missed at the start of January. The swimming gala will be on April 10th, before the Easter Holidays.

Student Teachers:

Student teachers have to do placements in various schools as part of their course. We take student teachers into every class every year. It helps the next generation to prepare to join

the teaching profession and it also allows our students to experience a different approach and teaching style. This builds their resilience and adaptability. Our teachers get to see our students from a different perspective and it also provides an extra adult in the classroom which helps our students. As a school we also have access to the latest developments in education through our links with the colleges of education.

East Cork Studios:

Austin and Gwen took our usual annual photographs this month. They will have the proofs ready soon and you will be able to purchase whatever you like from them. We display our Junior Infants and 6th Class each year and we have an impressive collection going back many years at this stage.

Junior Infant Screening:
